6.1 Non-compliance with the Accessibility Regulations

We recognise that some of the Learning Hub content doesn't comply with the Accessibility Regulations. 7 PREPARATION OF THIS ACCESSIBILITY STATEMENT

This statement was prepared on 26 May 2020. It was last reviewed on 17 March 2023.

This website was last tested in 2020. The test was carried out by Health Education England. The sessions chosen were the most accessed sessions and testing was for the standard accessibility guidelines, for example:

- using a keyboard instead of a mouse
- changing browser settings to make content easier to read
- changing colours, contrast levels, and fonts
- zooming in up to 300% without the text spilling off the screen

Future testing is planned for 2023 following updates to the Learning Hub which will address known accessibility issues.
